- The tour will start @8:45
- Meet at Trackside pub, platform 2, Bury Bolton Street Station **arrive 10-15 minutes before start time.**
- Each tour lasts approximately 6 h and finishes back at The Trackside
- On the train ride you will hear stories about the local area by the professional tour guide
- Along the route you will visit a number of recommended pubs or bars, the tour guide will continue to talk through history of the brewing industry in the area.
- 9:05 Full line steam to Ramsbottom
- Tours include a bottle of ale unless stated otherwise.
- 10:19 Arrive at Ramsbottom with coffee stop at Owens Restaurant/bar.
- 11:00 Walk to Summer seat – Midday lunch/half beer at Hammers Arms Summer seat– **please advise if you have any dietary requirements.**
- 13:29 Diesel from Summer seat to Rawtenstall – visit the Buffer Stops Bar.
- 15:10 Steam to Irwell Vale, walk up to beer stop – The Coacj
- 16:57 Diesel back to bury – end of tour.

- Guided tours – the guided tour is a 12 – mile route in total.
- The maximum number of attendees on a Rail Ale Trail is 25. This is to ensure that the tour guide can give everyone a complete experience.
- Our guided tours are structured day trips and feature scheduled stops with commentary along the way.
- The guided tour includes a full line return trip.
- While guests are advised to stick with the guide and their group for the day – you are free to deviate from the chosen route if you do so
- Keep hold of purchase so that you are not charged any separate train fares on the day.

- Whilst friendly dogs are permitted on the train (seated on the floor) some pubs along the way might not allow dogs, its best to check ahead if you wish to bring your dog..
